- 1. What are the key elements and characteristics of a *worker-driven* monitoring of global supply chains? With reference to at least one case, demonstrate how this form of monitoring could improve labour standards.
- 2. With reference to particular cases of migration *between countries in the Global South* outline what factors lead to work and health vulnerabilities of migrant workers? How is this experienced?

Section B (answer one question only from Section B)

- 3. Using the example of recent immigration policy in the UK discuss Brah et al.'s (1999: 5) view that 'a world market in labour does not exist in the same way as it does for goods and services. Labour markets are predominately regulated at the national level, and multiple barriers are experienced by both "legal" and "illegal" migrants.'
- 4. Critically assess why women continue to be under-represented as expatriate managers.
